The conference will highlight the most important findings from the NESC work with noted scholars and prominent practitioners elaborating on its implications for future reform of important human services. There will also be a series of workshops in which participants can assess the challenges and possibilities in delivering high quality services in particular areas.

The conference includes speakers of international and national renown on public sector reform, social regulation and quality improvement, along with contributions on a number of human services areas such as education, disability and eldercare.
